- Key highlights: impacts grades K-8
- Strand A Transferable skills, digital media literacy, applications, connections and contributions. Language will only be given one mark.
- Strand B Oral and non-verbal communication, language foundations for reading & writing, language conventions for reading & writing.
- Strand C Comprehension & understanding and responding to texts.
- Strand D Composition: expressing ideas and creating texts
- Cursive writing coming back.
- UFLI the program being used to address decoding + sound + blending components of the new language curriculum.

### Well-being

Results of positive school climate data

- 85.6% STUDENTS FEEL SAFE IN SCHOOL
- 81.5% STUDENTs feel like they're accepted by staff
- 92.8% of staff treat students with respect
- 97% of students participate in extracurricular activities
- 84.9% students who have not witnessed or been bullied

### Areas of growth

- by grade 7, 58% of students feel like they belong or are connected to the school.
- 66% of our black students feel like they belong & are connected to our school.



- 57 % of students feel like they have in put on their learning
- 54% of black students felt like they were involved in meaningful and engaged learning.
- 62.5% of students feel supported while at school.
- Staff seeking ways to improve lower scores.

### **Next Steps**

- meet as a positive school climate team to review data & update Bully Prevention Intervention plan posted on website.
- Continue CCPI (critically conscious practitioner inquiry) as a team to continue to address our inquiry question in our teaching practice.
  - O What happens when we intentionally center black student intersectional identities into the curriculum, inclusive of selecting teaching resources & strategies?
- dividing the school into house colors and dividing up assemblies by color group instead of division to further build connectedness (in October).
   Typically divided by primary, jr, intermediate. Celebrate successes by house colors instead.
